Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

At the time of this writing, we have had 3 funerals within the walls of our church in 3 weeks. Different circumstances, different families, but one thing which has been true of all of them, is the sense of family and community that the congregation has for its members, both current and former.

There are many things for which I am grateful, or perhaps better stated, there are many things which I have taken for granted, that society takes for granted. One of those things, is death. I don't think it's any one person's fault, but in the age of bodily autonomy, death is seen as final, or simply a consequence of life. In recent conversations with funeral directors, and after much reading on my part, this seems to be the trend in society.

We see a lack of people wanting funerals. We see no services, or graveside services only. There is certainly nothing wrong with that in some situations, but for society, this has become the norm. The rise of point and click funeral options allow us to minimize the sting of death. It simply makes the body a vessel and largely ignores the fact that there is something which comes after our death.

We do not grieve as others who have no hope, St. Paul says. The church is different. This is what makes the church unique. We see it through to the end. We understand the wages of sin is death, but we also understand that because of Christ's work on the cross, because of His resurrection, our loved ones, and ourselves, have conquered death.

As we gather at church for the funerals of our loved ones, of our church family, we grieve. But not as ones who have no hope. We grieve because this person, whoever it is has left us. We grieve because they are no longer here. But we also celebrate the fact that our loved one has passed through death into life. We are sad because they are gone, but we are happy about what they have gained.

I say all of this because I think it is important that you hear it. It is so wonderful to see a congregation who really does have the truest sense of fellowship which St. Paul talks about in his letter to the Philippians. ¹⁴ **Yet it was kind of you to share my trouble.** The church grieves together at the death of one of its members. So also does the church rejoice together when a child is brought to life in the saving waters of Holy Baptism.

From womb to tomb, the Church is a family, adopted as sons through baptism, and nurtured through the Lord's Word and sacraments. We share with one another, in times of celebration and in times of grief.

On **Friday and Saturday, March 4th and 5th**, once again, the cafeteria at Wyneken Memorial Lutheran School, 11565 N US Highway 27, Decatur, Indiana, will be full of activity; as we plan to pack 83,500 meals, at our annual event, to benefit the **Pack Away Hunger** campaign.

Pack Away Hunger is a nonprofit organization dedicated to greatly improving the lives of children and others who suffer from hunger and malnutrition. To achieve our mission, we have partnered with The Mathile Institute for Human Nutrition to develop the most highly nutritious pre-packaged meals available. These meals are scientifically proven to meet the specific nutritional needs of children and other at-risk populations. This meal remains easy and safe to transport, and culturally acceptable worldwide. If you would like to know more about this non-for-profit organization, you can go to their website, www.packawayhunger.org.

Traditionally, (2/3-3/4), of the meals packed will remain in Adams, Wells, and Allen Counties. We have several food pantries in the community that have expressed interest in receiving the meals, as well as, after school back pack programs. The remaining, (1/4-1/3,) will be distributed internationally to the countries of Guatemala and Haiti through international partner networks. The need for these meals is just as great now as it has been in past years. If you are interested in donating funds to help offset the \$25,000 needed to make our goal, please make your check payable to **Pack Away Hunger** and mail it to: Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church, Friedheim, Attn: Pack Away Hunger, 10653 North 550 West, Decatur, IN 46733. If possible, we would like to have all funds raised by **Monday, February 21st.**

On **Friday, March 4th**, we will have 150+ student volunteers, from our own Wyneken School, working in fellowship together, to pack meals benefitting other children and families in their community.

On **Saturday, March 5th**, we will need 220+ total volunteers for packing that day. The two shifts, of 110 volunteers each, will be held from 9:00—11:30am and from 1:00—3:30pm. If you belong to an organization or club, (such as National Honor Society or 4-H), that encourages community service hours, this event is the place for you! We will be providing forms to record your volunteer hours for those who need them. This event is also a wonderful opportunity for parents, (and grandparents), to volunteer with their children and to work on a project together. Whether you are 6 or 90 or somewhere in between, there is a job for you! Bruce and Brenda Scherer.....

A lifelong member of our St. Peter Lutheran Church, Bruce David Scherer was born on June 15, 1949, at Adams County Hospital to Robert and Lavon (Bauermeister) Scherer. He was their second of five children. His siblings include Keith, Kevin, Robyn (deceased at 3 ½), and Barry. The family lived on Barkley Road, where Kevin continues to live. Bob worked at Rea Magnet Wire, milked cows, farmed 120 acres, and drove school bus for Hoagland High School (Madison Twp.). Because he worked second shift at Rea Magnet Wire, he milked the cows at noon and midnight daily. Keith and Bruce alternated helping with midnight milking on weekends. They had 15 cows and Lloyd Scherer picked up the milk that was for sale. In addition to milking, Bruce helped with farming, starting to drive tractor at around 10 years old. Lavon was a homemaker and stayed at home with the children until just before Barry was born. Then she got a job as a cook at Hoagland grade school.

Bruce was baptized at our St. Peter church and later attended the grade school here. There were 11 in his class, including John Fuelling, Dave Matthews, Dennis Boerger, Dan Wietfeldt, Cindy (Fuelling) Wass, LouAnn (Fuelling) Wolfe, Susie Kimberlin, Angela Boerger, Mary Gerke, and Jean Gresley. During his 8 years at St. Peter grade school, he had two teachers- Mrs. Justice and Teacher Grotrian. He played on the baseball and basketball grade school teams. He was a pitcher for the grade school, batting right and throwing right. A favorite memory is hitting a grand slam at Soest (even though he batted out of order!) Basketball games were played at Monmouth and Hoagland. At home, Bruce helped with farming, the family garden, and dishes. The Scherer family did not take vacations during those years. Every year on the last day of school, St. Peter held an ice cream social in the picnic grove. And every year, Bruce's Bauermeister grandparents came to the ice cream social and took him home with them to Ossian, so that he could help them with farming. He spent every summer in Ossian and returned home just before the first day of school.

Bruce was confirmed at St. Peter, then attended Hoagland High School. Three St. Peter classmates went to Hoagland H.S. with him- Dane Wietfeldt, Susie Kimberlin, and Jean Gresley. In high school, his favorite subject was gymnastics. Hoagland had a gymnastics team and Bruce went to Regionals on the trampoline competition. Keith Scherer and Dan Wietfeldt were also on the team. Keith competed on the High Bar and Dan competed on the rings and the floor exercises. Bruce also ran Cross Country for two years. During his junior and senior years, Bruce lived in Ossian and helped with farming after school. In high school, Bruce's best friend, next door neighbor, and gymnastics teammate was Greg Perry. Bruce graduated in 1967. It was the second to the last year that Hoagland had its own high school.

What about Brenda.....

Brenda Kaye Hegerfeld was born at Lutheran Hospital on June 9, 1954, to Robert and Helene Hegerfeld. Shew as their oldest child and only daughter. Her three younger brothers include Stan, David, and Brent. The family home was on Minnich Road near Hoagland. Bob worked at City Glass for his entire adult life, retiring as part owner. Helene was a homemaker. Brenda was baptized at Flatrock by Pastor Abram. She later attended Flatrock grade school with about seventeen students in her class. Her best friends were Becky Springer (now Zelt) and Beth Hoffman (who passed away at age 16). Her favorite teacher was Mrs. Mary Zelt. During her grade school years, Brenda took piano lessons from Helen Reynolds. She was also a cheerleader for the 7th and 8th grade basketball teams. The Hegerfelds took a family vacation each year, often to visit family, as well as to Washington D.C. and the Wisconsin Dells.

Brenda was confirmed at Flatrock by Pastor Frank, then attended Heritage High School. Her class was the first to go all four years at the new consolidated high school. There were approximately 300 students in her class. Brenda played the flute and participated in marching band and concert band. She sang in the choir and participated in FTA. During the summers and on Sunday, Brenda worked for Hoagland Hayloft. They served family style meals on Sundays, and she was a server. She also helped with some of their catering events. Brenda graduated in 1972.

After high school, Bruce joined the Air Force and was part of the Air National Guard at Baer Field. He completed his basic training at Lackland AF Base in Texas, went to Tech School at Amarillo, and then spent the remainder of his six years at Baer Field serving on weekends and 2 weeks in the summers. Bruce worked as a

typist since he was able to type 60 words per minute. After high school, Brenda got a job with an accounting company in Ft. Wayne, then went to Hoosier Wire Die, then to Wabash Fiber Box.

So how did they meet?

Bruce owned a cottage at Crooked Lake. Brenda had a friend whose parents rented a cottage at the same lake. They met when Brenda was visiting her friend at Crooked Lake. They started dating, though neither can remember where they went on their first date. It was the summer of 1970, and Bruce owned what he says was his favorite car- a 1969 Plymouth Roadrunner. They were married January 24, 1975, at Flatrock by Pastor Frank. Kevin Scherer was best man, and Keith Scherer was also in the wedding. Dorothy Holle was the organist, and she and Brenda's brother, Stan, surprised them at the wedding with a duet of "The Lord Bless You and Keep You." Their reception was at Goeglein's for about 500 people followed by a honeymoon in the Bahamas.

Bruce and Brenda's first home was at the Ossian farmhouse where Bruce had lived in high school. They were given the house and half of a beef in exchange for Bruce's help with farming. At this time, Bruce was working at Harvester. He worked at Harvest in Ft. Wayne for 14 years, then worked at Harvester in Springfield, Ohio for another 14 years, before retiring at age 55. Brenda worked for a company that made drivers' licenses. (Their company changed names several times during the 34 years that she worked there before retiring).

Bruce and Brenda are the proud parents of Casey and Kari. They have three grandchildren. They moved to their current home on the county line road before Casey started school. They wanted him to attend SPI. By this time, Brenda had transferred her membership to St. Peter, too.

During their married life, they have been active members of Hoagland Area Advancement Association, a bowling team, and have participated in many, many fundraisers. They feel that their participation in the building of St. Peter-Immanuel Lutheran School is one of their proudest accomplishments. They have enjoyed many vacations to favorite spot New Smyrna Beach in Florida. They also vacationed when going to Kari's dance competitions over the years. Another favorite trip was a 3-week, 6,000-mile trip out west. As servant members of St. Peter's, Brenda has served on Altar Guild and sang in the choir. Bruce has been a deacon, elder, vice president, and trustee. He was also a player, then coach, of the Fuelling Aces softball team. He commented that he greatly admires the teamwork and unselfish play exhibited by Don Gerke on that team. Bruce also noted that his favorite hymn is "God Loves Me Dearly."

Thank you, Bruce and Brenda, for sharing your story, and for all that you do for our St. Peter congregation.
